

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS



General Volunteer Info

The gift of your time makes such a difference in the lives of the people we serve. To begin the volunteer process with Alternatives, please scan the QR code to submit an interest form and attend a volunteer orientation. At your orientation, you will learn more about our volunteer positions and current openings. An application is required for all positions. You will be sent an online application after you attend an orientation. Trainings for all positions are provided throughout the year.



Client Services

Through non-judgmental, compassionate care and medically-accurate education, our Client Services team supports women and men faced with a life-altering pregnancy decision or compromised sexual health. Training is provided and required for all client service positions.

24-Hour Helpline Information Assistance

Listen and assist callers with information about our services after office hours and on weekends. One weeknight and one weekend shift required each month. Training provided.

Momma Mentor (2-year Commitment – 2 Times a Month)

Walk with a mom as she enters the journey of motherhood. Provide education and support to help her be the best mother she can be. Mentorship extends from pregnancy until her child is one year of age.

Men's Services Volunteer (2-year Commitment – 2 Times a Month)

Serve men who accompany their partners by providing a space for them to gather resources and process their role in a pregnancy decision. Also, support a male client and help him become an involved, committed, and responsible father. Mentorship extends from early pregnancy until his child is one year of age. Training provided.

Medical

Works in conjunction with the medical team to provide patient care and medical services in Alternatives Clinics. Must have at least 2–3 years of experience and an active license. Training provided.

Sonographer (1-2-year Commitment – Weekly Availability)

Perform ultrasound scans on pregnant women to determine gestational age, viability and location of the pregnancy. MD, RDMS, NP, RN or DO required. Experience required. Training is provided. Availability is based on need. 1-2 years of medical experience required and an active license.

STD Clinician (1-2-year Commitment – Weekly Availability)

Use nursing skills to perform STD/STI testing on women in our community while maintaining professional standard of care according to ANA code of ethics. RN/NP/PA required. 2-4 years experience in a hospital or outpatient setting required. Training in therapeutic communication and physical exam will be provided.

Medical Ambassadors

Inform the medical community about Alternatives and connect us to medical providers.

Community Engagement

Join a team of people who are passionate about the well-being of teens, women and men and want to raise awareness of the programs and services of Alternatives throughout Denver. All community positions have a 1-year commitment. Training is provided. Opportunities are on an “as needed” basis.

Tabling Representative

Host interactive, information tables at resource fairs throughout the city.

Community Ambassadors

Connect Alternatives to your business, high school or college campus.

Call Campaign Volunteers

Thank donors and churches for their support and inform that about ways to engage with us.

Speakers Bureau

Speak on behalf of Alternatives at church and community events and gatherings.

Church Liaison

Serve as a connector between Alternatives and your church.

Administrative Support

Office Support volunteers play a key role in helping us carry out our mission by providing important administrative support for successful operations. All positions have a 1-year commitment. Training is provided. Opportunities are on an “as needed” basis.

Office Support

Assist with in-office projects like stuffing envelopes, preparing mailings or making phone calls individually or with a small group.

Pick-Ups & Deliveries

Transport donated items to and from our office locations.

Events

Join the steering committee that plans and executes two annual fundraising events. Assist with event support, prepare and/or serve meals at trainings and meetings throughout the year.

Food Services

Bless fellow volunteers attending training with a meal or come alongside the Volunteer Development Manager to set and clean up the meals at training.
