# Volunteer Fatherhood Mentor

# Reports To: Men's Program Director

# **Position Summary:**

The Volunteer Fatherhood Mentor empowers first-time fathers by providing a non-judgmental space to process and learn about manhood, fatherhood basics and characteristics. The Volunteer Fatherhood Mentor will enter into a long-term one-on-one relationship with the client and will help educate, enable and encourage him to become an involved and effective father.

# Responsibilities

- Follow Alternatives' Policies and Procedures.
- Meet on a bi-weekly basis with clients who are first-time fathers or fathers-to-be.
- Partner with other Men's Program Fatherhood Mentors, Client Advocates and Client Services Staff to serve the client/family unit.
- Maintain quality client records.
- Maintain confidentiality in all client situations and circumstances.
- Review assigned client files at each shift and follow through on appropriate case management tasks.
- Debrief with the Men's Program Director regarding client sessions and follow-up case work.
- Demonstrate a working knowledge and memorization of the Seven Fundamentals from the Equipped to Serve training.
- Demonstrate knowledge and proficiency in sharing and leading clients through fatherhood resources.
- Commit to attending Alternatives' Continuing Education Events to remain equipped to meet with clients.
- Dress casually and modestly.

#### **Time Commitment**

- Upon completion of training, at least one year of serving two to four shifts per month (each shift is two hours long).
- Attend three Alternatives Continuing Education Events per year.
- Inform the Men's Program Director as soon as possible if unable to make assigned shift.
- Attend quarterly Men's Program "get-togethers".

# Training and Support Plan

Complete all elements of the on-boarding process (Volunteer

Orientation, Training Prerequisite Seminar, *Equipped to Serve* 4-day classroom training and the On The Job training checklist, Fatherhood Mentor 1-day training).

Refreshment of skills through reviewing fatherhood resources,

literature, practicing occasional role-plays, attending Alternatives' Continuing

Education Events and participating in an annual skills observation and evaluation.

On-going supervision with the Men's Program Director.
