Position Summary:

Food Services Volunteers bless and nourish prospective volunteers, fellow volunteers, and staff training volunteers. Food fuels our bodies and minds and training can be long and stretching. A meal can make a positive impact and show appreciation. Food Service Volunteers can also assist with set up/clean up before and after the meal is served so that staff training volunteers can focus on the training.

Time Commitment:

There are about 10 trainings a year where a breakfast, lunch or dinner need to be provided. Food Service Volunteers only sign up for one food item or set/clean up shift if they are available and financially able.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Sign up to provide a food item AND/OR a set up/clean up shift when needs arise (if you are available).
- Communicate with the Volunteer Development when unavailable or when needing to deliver food before the set date.
- Provide a meal item according to instructions provided and by the set date.

General Requirements:

- Committed to Alternatives' mission statement and the sanctity of human life.
- Signed agreement of Alternatives' Statement of Faith and Principle.
